All residents are required to have their Summerlakes ID. Guests must also have some form of photo ID before entering the Clubhouse and/or Pool. Homeowners must also be current with the monthly assessments to use the Clubhouse and/or Pool.

BABY-SITTER POLICY FOR SUMMERLAKES POOL USAGE

This policy is intended for the summertime Baby-Sitter or Nanny hired by a Summerlakes Homeowner to watch their children during the *summer months only*.

- ◆ The Baby-Sitter or Nanny must be at least 14 years old or have graduated from the 8th grade.
- ◆ The Baby-Sitter or Nanny is hired to watch the children for **one** designated household within Summerlakes.
- ◆ The Baby-Sitter form must be filled out and signed by the Summerlakes Homeowner who hired the sitter.
- ◆ The resident who hired the Baby-Sitter or Nanny must be current with their assessments.
- ◆ The Baby-Sitter **may not** bring in a guest while they are on baby-sitting duty.
- ◆ If the Baby-Sitter or Nanny is not a Summerlakes resident themselves, they must pay a guest fee (\$5.00)

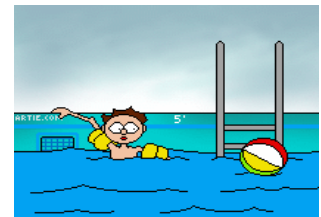
COMMUNITY ALERT

The Warrenville Police Department is investigating several reports of a male attempting to lure juvenile children in the Country Ridge Apartment complex into secluded areas of the building(s) to "help" him with various tasks, and has made promises of candy to them in return for their help. No juveniles approached have accepted the subject's offer or have been harmed in any of these incidents.

The identity of the subject is unknown, but is described as a male white, possibly between 5'8" and 6' tall, and having a medium build. The subject's hair description varies and it is possible that he has altered his appearance to avoid being identified. The subject is also believed to be driving a dark colored 4-door vehicle. The police department has learned of several other juveniles being approached by a man matching this description, who did not initially report the incident(s). These incidents have occurred between the hours of 6 p.m. and 8 p.m.

The police department has increased patrol in the area and encourages parents and general public to know their children's whereabouts, and to be vigilant in reporting any suspicious persons speaking with groups of younger children, by dialing 9-1-1.

At Last Summer Has Arrived!

Our pool is open and our grounds crew is busy trying to get our grounds in shape and keep them that way. Just like everyone else the cold wet spring has put us behind in our projects as well. Our mowing has begun but between wet ground and mechanical problems with our smaller tractor we have not been able to cut some areas. We have not forgotten these areas and will be getting to them as quickly as possible.

We also ask that homeowners check their property and address any winter damage they might find. According to our bylaws all structures, including fences are to be maintained, non functioning vehicles are not permitted in yards or driveways, etc. Maintaining our properties is beneficial to our entire community.

While we humans are out enjoying the warmer weather we need to be aware that others are as well. The local coyotes, skunks, raccoons and opossums have all been busy expanding their families over the winter so it is important to remind children not to approach any 'puppies' they see, but not to run away from them either. Instead it is recommended to throw things, shout, or otherwise make noise to encourage the coyotes to move away. It is not recommended to leave small dogs outside unattended as many pets have been attacked. Also please do not feed any of the wildlife; it is against local ordinances to do so and only creates problems when the wildlife becomes dependent on the handouts.

We need some guidance with some of our plants. The plants in the hot tub room need refurbishing-anyone with expertise on indoor plants? We could use your help with this project. And there are several outdoor beds that need some work-anyone have any ideas on plantings? We're looking to plant low maintenance perennials but we're open to suggestions. 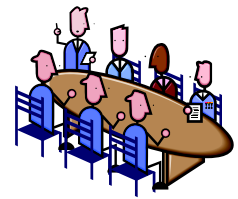
