Some of our Summerlakes residents are wild animals. We humans need to accept that they are here find ways to co-exist. After all we all chose to move here because it is a semi-rural area surrounded by parks and open spaces.

COYOTES

We've had dens of coyotes here since the first houses were built. These animals are most active dusk to dawn but do venture out on overcast days as well. They are more active in the spring because they are having babies right now. For the most they eat mice, moles and other little creatures we probably don't want

Trapping coyotes is not effective. If you move one out another will only move in to take its' place. A better option is to make them unwelcome. Do not leave food laying around on the ground, this includes food scraps for squirrels, rabbits, birds etc. Do not feed pets outside - the coyotes might find that kibble tastier than your cat or dog does. Coyotes will also snack on small animals so keep your cats, and small dogs inside or watch them when they are outside. Chickens and rabbits need to be in secured pens that are inspected

When out on a walk either with or without a pet and you encounter a coyote make yourself menacing, do not run away. Make a noise, pick up or pull your pet (and small children) close to you and act scary. Coyotes are not very brave and will move away. If you enjoy early morning or late night walks carry a noise maker - a whistle, a small air horn, or a can filled with marbles or pennies to shake or throw at them.

OPPOSSUMS

These are certainly not the most attractive creatures but they are also one of the most harmless and most beneficial of our wildlife. They are very shy and will either run away or play dead if startled. They are the least likely to ever have rabies. The best thing they do for us is eat about 5,000 ticks each summer. Ticks spread all sorts of diseases that can sicke and even kill pets and humans and are a far bigger danger.

PREVENTATIVE MEASURES

Keep your garage doors closed unless you are actually in the garage yourself.

Do not leave pet food sitting out where wild animals can access.

Secure trash can lids and pick up anything that spilled during collection.
